Local Growth Fund 2015/16 Funding and Status Report



Funding Allocation

Through the initial and second round of <u>Growth Deals</u>, the West of England LEP secured a total of £149.3m from the government's Local Growth Fund (LGF) to be invested in the West of England from 2015 - 2021, of which £16.6m of LGF was awarded for spend within 2015/16.

How the funds were spent

By the end of March 16, the programme had successfully made available the full **£16.6m** of grant from government to meet the costs of local scheme delivery on the following approved projects.

- 4 approved schemes progressing with Grant Offer Letter- Expansion of the Open Programmable City Region (OPCR; City of Bristol College Advanced Engineering Centre Extension; Bristol and Bath Cultural Destinations Media Bank; and Aztec West Roundabout
- 6 schemes approved with conditions Advanced Composites Bridge Construction; Superfast Broadband Extension Programme; Bath & North East Somerset Construction Skills Centre, S&B Automotive Virtual Reality Training in Skills; West Wick Roundabout and North South Link; and Sustainable Transport Package 2016/17
